1. Grading systems of the institutions

The grade system is on scale ranging from 1 to 10. The pass mark is 5; 8 and 9 grades are awarded for good and very good and 10 is excellent.

UASVM of Bucharest uses the ECTS system and all the foreign students receive a certificate with the converted Romanian grades to the European system one.

2. Visa
